

## Instructions

The first step is to confirm the printed paper size by placing a credit card inside the outline to the right.

When using a string or printed sizer, pull tightly so the string or sizer fits snug to produce an accurate size.

Measure your fingers at the end of the day when it is largest and not when your fingers are cold or damp.

Bands or rings wider than 5mm may fit more tightly than rings or bands of the same size in narrower widths.

## Verify Printed Paper Size

If your credit card (54mm) lines up with this outline, your print scale is correct.



## Determine Your Ring Size

### Method 1: Create Your Own


You will need:

- String, Yarn, or a thin strip of paper
- Pen or Marker
- Ruler

1. Cut a piece of string at least 3 inches long.
2. Wrap it around the base of the finger you plan to wear your ring on. Make it snug!
3. Mark when the ends overlap with a pen or marker.
4. Lay the string flat and measure the length with a ruler in millimeters.
5. Use the Ring Size Chart below to find your correlating ring size.

### Method 2: Print Our Sizer

1. Cut out the ring sizer below.
2. Wrap the sizer snugly around the widest part of the correct finger so that the numbers are visible to you and insert the pointed end through the slit you made in the sizer.
3. Note the number that lines up with the slit. This is your ring size! Please remember that quarter sizes are available if your sizer indicates that you are between whole and half sizes.



### Method 3: Measure a Current Ring

1. Take a ring that properly fits the finger you are trying to size. In the US and Canada, engagement rings and wedding bands are most often worn on the left hand's ring finger.
2. Place the ring over each of the circles below until the outline is touching the inside edges of the ring.
3. If the ring is between two of the sizes, order the quarter size in the middle.

## Ring Size Chart

Measurements are equivalent to the interior circumference of the corresponding ring size.
