Thermographs of 14 Day Study

These are the thermographs of the injured hock before, during, and after, 14 days of treatment with Total Joint Care Performance. A thermograph was taken initially (shown top left) to establish a base line. The second thermograph (shown top right) was taken on day 4 and shows a 27% reduction in thermal gradients.

The final thermograph (shown below) was taken on day 14, and shows a 76% reduction in thermal gradients. These thermographs were taken of a three year old Standardbred who has been actively racing from the age of two years old. The horse was started on Total Joint Care Performance the morning after he raced with a time of 1:57 1/8. This horse has not been on any injectable NSAID or any other joint medications for four weeks prior to, or during, the testing period. The horse raced again on day 15 and finished with a time of 1:56 flat.
