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4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air in case of accidental inhalation of dust or fumes from

plenty of water. Do not remove solidified product. Cover affected areas with clean sheeting or gauze and seek immediate medical attention. No attempt should be made to remove material from skin or to remove contaminated

clothing as damaged skin can be easily torn.

Eye contact: If eye contact occurs with molten material immediately cool with water. Do not

remove adhesive. Seek medical attention.

Ingestion: Ingestion of solid adhesive is not expected to be hazardous. If symptoms

develop and persist, get medical attention.
