FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Approximately 62" across x 29" down center

YARN

BERROCO MANTRA STONEWASH
(50 grs): 5 balls #4497 Mountain

HOOKS and NOTIONS

Crochet hook, size 4.00 mm (F)
or size to obtain gauge

GAUGE

Motif 1 = 3¼" square

To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

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We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this book are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. We cannot be responsible for variance of individual knitters, human or typographical errors.

All pattern PDFs are updated when corrections are made. In the event of finding an error, please make sure you've downloaded the most recent version.

NOTE

This shawl is made up of square motifs joined together on the 3rd round. Triangular motifs are then joined on the last row to fill in the gaps. See diagram on page 5 for layout of motifs. We suggest weaving in ends as you work so the only finishing is blocking.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

3dc cluster: [Yo, pull up a loop in ch-1 sp, yo and pull through 2 loops] 3 times, yo and pull through all loops on hook

4dc cluster: [Yo, pull up a loop in ch-1 sp, yo and pull through 2 loops] 4 times, yo and pull through all loops on hook

5-ch Picot: Ch 5, sl st in stitch at base of ch-5

3-ch Picot: Ch 3, sl st in stitch at base of ch-3

SHAWL INSTRUCTIONS

MOTIF 1

Begin with a sliding loop.

Rnd 1: Ch 4 (counts as 1 dc + ch 1), [dc into loop, ch 1] 11 times, join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. Pull up sliding loop to close center opening.

Rnd 2: Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 2 (counts as 1 hdc), 3dc cluster in same ch-1 sp, ch 2, 4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, * tr in next dc, ch 3, [4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 2] twice, 4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 3; rep from * twice more, tr in next dc, ch 3, 4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 2, join with a sl st in top of 3dc cluster at beg of rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, * sc in top of dc cluster, 5-ch Picot, ch 2, skip [ch 2, dc cluster], 5 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, tr in tr, 3-ch Picot, ch 1, 5 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, skip [dc cluster, ch 3], rep from * 3 times more, join with a sl st in first sc of rnd. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Note: The corner of this motif is the center point of your triangle.

MOTIF 2

Work Rnds 1 and 2 as for Motif 1.





Rnd 3 (Joining Rnd): Ch 1, sc in top of dc cluster, 5-ch Picot, ch 2, skip [ch 2, dc cluster], 5 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, tr in tr, ch 1, sl st in 3-ch Picot of adjoining motif, * ch 1, sl st in top of tr, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, sl st in center dc of adjoining motif, 2 dc in same ch-3 sp, ch 2, skip [dc cluster, ch 2], sc in top of next dc cluster, ch 2, sl st in 5-ch Picot of adjoining motif, ch 2, sl st in stitch at base of ch 2 at beginning of picot, skip [ch 2, dc cluster], 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, sl st in center dc of adjoining motif, 2 dc in same ch-3 sp, ch 1, tr in tr, ch 1, sl st in 3-ch Picot of adjoining motif, complete as for Rnd 3 of Motif 1. Weave in ends.

Make Motif 2s, joining as you work, working 1 more motif on each row until you have 11 motifs joined across last row (see diagram on page 5). **Note:** If joining 2 sides of motif, rep from * once more during Rnd 3 before completing as for Rnd 3 of Motif 1.

MOTIF 3 (Triangular Motif)

This motif fills in the gaps of the last row of Motif 2s, forming a straight edge at the top of your shawl.

Begin with a sliding loop.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 4 (counts as 1 dc + ch 1), [dc into loop, ch 1] 5 times, dc into loop, turn—7 dc + 6 ch-1 sp. Pull up sliding loop.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 6 (counts as 1 tr + ch 3), [4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 2] twice, 4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, tr in next dc, ch 3, [4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 2] twice, 4dc cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, tr in 3rd ch of beg ch-4.

Row 3 (RS, Joining Row): Ch 4 (counts as 1 tr), ch 1, sl st in ch-3 Picot of adjoining motif, ch 1, * sl st in top of tr, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, sl st in center dc of adjoining motif, 2 dc in same ch-3 sp, ch 2, skip [dc cluster, ch 2], sc in top of next dc cluster, ch 2, sl st in 5-ch Picot of adjoining motif, ch 2, sl st in stitch at base of ch 2 at beginning of picot, ch 2, skip [ch 2, dc cluster], 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, sl st in center dc of adjoining motif, 2 dc in same ch-3 sp, ch 1, tr in next tr, ch 1, sl st in ch-3 Picot of adjoining motif, ch 1, rep from * once more, join with a sl st in tr. Fasten off. **Note:** If joining on only 1 side, omit sl sts and work ch-3 Picots and ch-5 Picots as on Row 3 of Motif 1. Weave in ends.

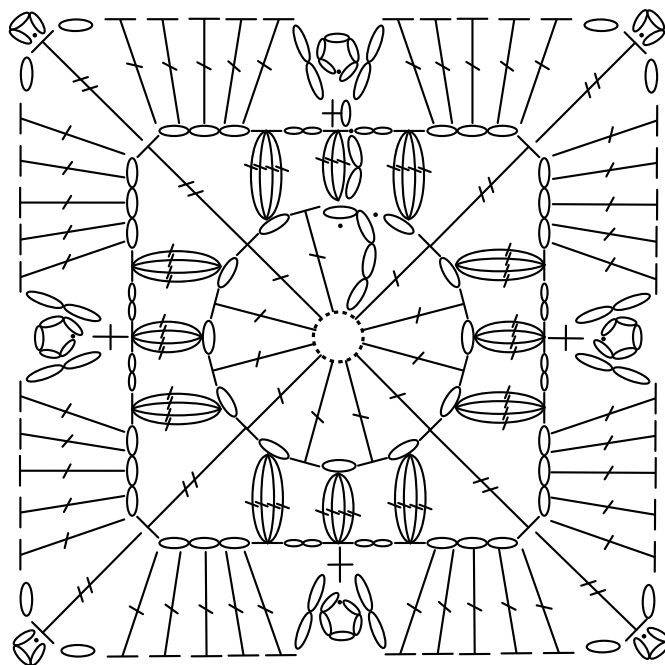
Make 12 total of Motif 3, filling in each gap from the last row of Motif 2s, as well as making one Motif 3 on each side, as shown on diagram on page 5.

Block as desired.

MOTIF 3

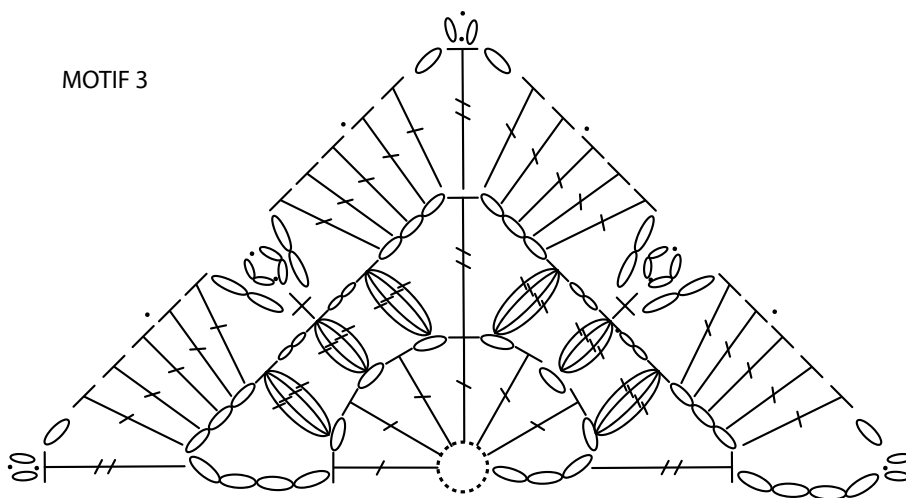
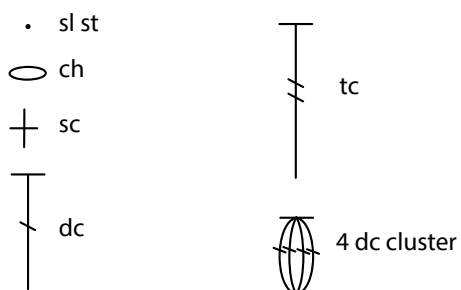
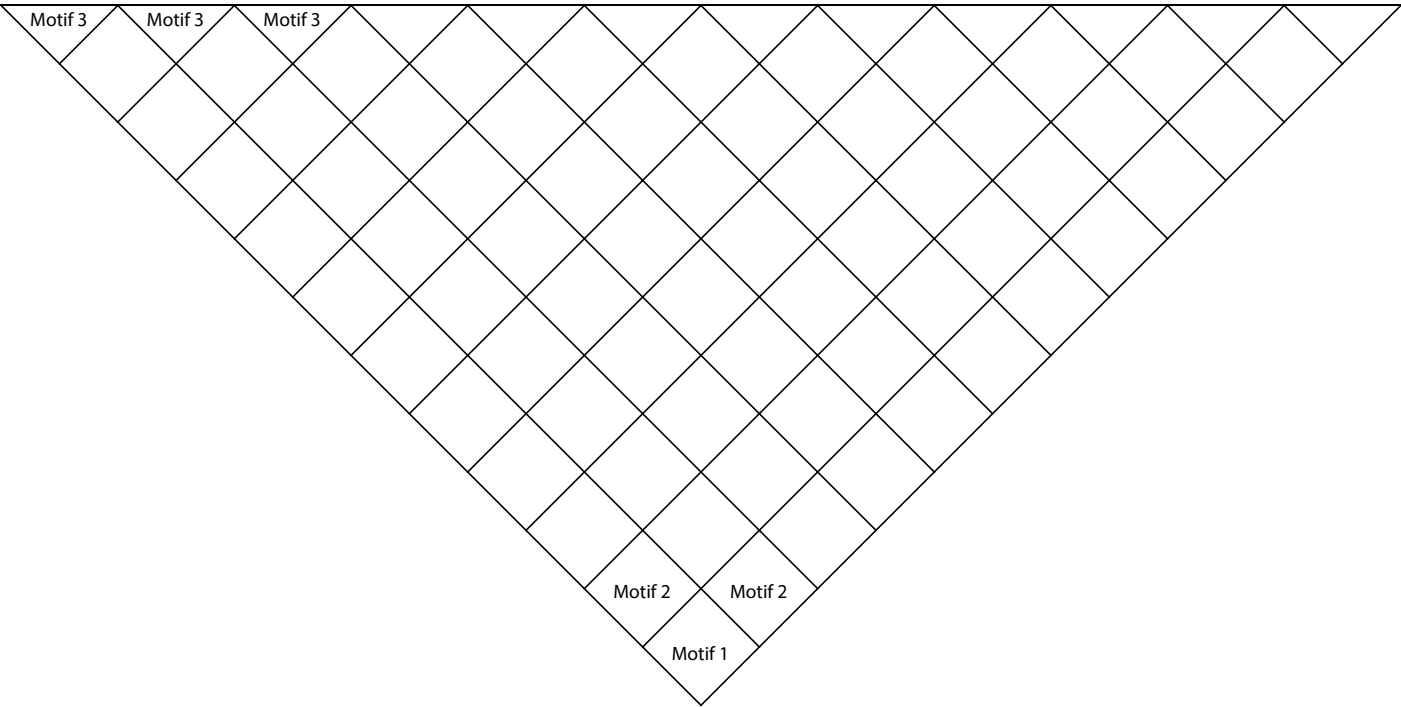


CHART KEY

STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning

CC: contrasting color

cont: continue

ch: chain

dec: decrease

dc: double crochet

dtr: double treble crochet

est: established

hdc: half double crochet

inc: increase

MC: main color

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

sc: single crochet

sl st: slip stitch

sliding loop: Form a loop of yarn around your fingers, with the end attached to the ball on the right and the tail on the left. Insert hook into the loop under both pieces of yarn and draw up a loop onto hook. (This does not count as your first stitch.) Work first row into the original loop. Pull up the yarn tail after your first row is complete to close the loop.

sp: space

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

tr: treble

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over

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
