FINISHED MEASUREMENTS Hat: Approximately 19" / 47.5 cm around x 11" / 27.5 cm high Mittens: Approximately 8" / 20 cm around hand x 12½" / 31 cm long

## YARN

1 ball #1132 Fox Point each for hat and mittens BERROCO ARTESIA (100 grs): 1 hank #4809 Sunflowers (total for the set)

BERROCO PROVIDENCE (50 grs):

# **NEEDLES and NOTIONS**

For Hat: 16" / 40 cm circular needles sizes 8 / 5 mm and 9 / 5.5 mm or size to obtain gauge 1 set double-pointed needles, size 9 / 5.5 mm 4 stitch markers (1 a different color for beg-of-rnd) Optional: Large pompom maker For Mittens: 32" / 80 cm circular needle (or your preference in needles for working small surfaces in the round), size 9 / 5.5 mm *or size to obtain gauge* 2 stitch markers (1 a different color for beg-of-rnd) Waste yarn to hold thumb

For Both: Tapestry needle

#### GAUGE

15 sts and 22 rnds = 4" / 10 cm in St st with the two yarns held together on larger needles *To save time and ensure accurate* measurements, take time to check gauge.



We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this book are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. We cannot be responsible for variance of individual knitters, human or typographical errors.

All pattern PDFs are updated when corrections are made. In the event of finding an error, please make sure you've downloaded the most recent version.

## NOTE

Berroco Providence and Berroco Artesia are held together throughout.

#### HAT

With smaller needle, using the two yarns held together, cast on 72 sts, place beg-of-rnd marker and join for working in the round.

Rnd 1: Knit.

Rnd 2: Knit across all stitches, wrapping the yarn 2 times around the needle for each stitch.

Rnd 3: \* Slip the next 6 sts from the LH needle to the RH, dropping the extra loop as you go; using the left needle tip pick up the first 3 sts from the group up and over the second 3 sts and place those 3 sts back on the LH needle, then slip the remaining 3 sts back to the LH needle, k6; repeat from \* to end.

Rnd 4: Knit.

Repeat Rnds 1-4 once more.

Change to larger needle.

Continue to work in pattern as established repeating Rnds 1-4 until hat measures 10" / 25 cm from the cast-on edge, ending with pattern Rnd 1 or 4. Continue working the crown shaping in St st as follows:

**Shape Crown: Next Rnd:** \* k18 pm, rep from \* twice more, knit to end—4 markers on needle.

**Dec Rnd:** \* K1, k2tog, knit to 2 sts before next marker, SSK, sm; rep from \* around—8 sts dec'd.

Knit 1 round.

Rep the last 2 rounds 6 times more—16 sts. Break yarn, leaving an 8" / 20 cm long end. Thread end into tapestry needle and draw through all stitches on needle. Pull up tightly and secure. Fasten off.


# **FINISHING**

Make 2-3" / 5-7.5 cm pompom using both yarns held together. Sew to top of hat.

Weave in all ends and block as desired.







# **MITTENS**

#### NOTE

Magic loop is the best method for knitting these mittens, however 4 double-pointed needles or the 2 circular needle method would also work.

### MITTENS (Make 2)

With larger needle, using the two yarns yarns held together, cast on 30 sts. Place beg-of-rnd marker and join for working in the round.

Work Rnds 1–4 as for hat until piece measures 5" / 12.5 cm from cast-on edge, end on either Rnd 1 or Rnd 4.

Work from here in St st.

**Thumb Gusset: Next Rnd:** M1L, k1, M1R, pm, knit to end—32 sts (3 sts in thumb gusset).

Knit 2 rounds.

Inc Rnd: M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, knit to end—34 sts (5 sts in thumb gusset).

Knit 2 rounds.

Rep the last 3 rounds 3 times more—40 sts (11 sts in thumb gusset).

**Divide for Thumb:** Next Rnd: K11, slip these stitches to waste yarn for thumb, remove marker, then knit to end—29 sts.

**Hand:** Next Rnd: Using backwards loop method, cast on 1 st, knit to end—30 sts.

Work even in St st until hand measures approximately 3" (or 1" before the end of your fingertips).

Shape Top: Dec Rnd 1: \* K1, k2tog, k10, SSK; rep from \* once more—26 sts.

Knit 1 round.

**Dec Rnd 2:** \* K1, k2tog, k8, SSK; rep from \* once more—22 sts. Knit 1 round.

**Dec Rnd 3:** \* K1, k2tog, k6, SSK; rep from \* once more—18 sts. Knit 1 round.

**Dec Rnd 4:** \* K1, k2tog, k4, SSK; rep from \* once more—14 sts. Break yarn leaving a 20" / 50 cm long tail.

Divide remaining stitches so that 7 sts from the beginning of the round are on one needle and 7 sts from the end of the round are on another. Thread 20" / 50 cm long tail into tapestry needle and graft the live stitches together using Kitchener Stitch.

# **FINISHING**

**Thumb:** With RS facing, slip 11 sts from waste yarn to dpns. Join yarn in last stitch, then pick up and knit 1 st in stitch cast on for hand—12 sts. Divide stitches onto 3 needles, place marker and join for working in the round. Work even in St st for 2" / 5 cm.

**Shape Top:** Dec Rnd 1: \* k2, k2tog; rep from \* around—9 sts. Knit 1 round.

**Dec Rnd 2:** \* K1, k2tog; rep from \* around—6 sts. Break yarn, leaving an 8" / 20 cm long tail. Join, using Kitchener Stitch as for hand.

Weave in all ends and block as desired.



#### STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning **CC**: contrasting color

CDD: Centered Double Decrease—Slip 2 together (as if to

k2tog), knit 1, pass the 2 slipped stitches over

cn: cable needle dec: decrease

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row. end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row Garter St: Knit EVERY row when working back and forth in rows. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working in the round.

inc: increase k: knit

**k tbl:** knit through the back loop(s) k2tog: knit 2 stitches together **k3tog:** knit 3 stitches together

**kfb:** knit in the front and back of the next st

LH: left hand

**LLI:** Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch

M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.

M1p: Make 1 purl—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1pL: Make 1 purl Left—Work as for M1p.

M1pR: Make 1 purl Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

MC: main color

**p**: purl

**p tbl:** purl through the back loop(s) p2tog: purl 2 stitches together p3tog: purl 3 stitches together

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat

Rev St st: Reverse Stockinette Stitch—Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round.

RH: right hand

**RLI:** Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

rnd(s): round(s) RS: right side sl: slip

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back loops.

SSSK: Slip 3 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 3 stitches and knit 3 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

**St st:** Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

**tbl:** through back loop(s)

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.

WS: wrong side

wyib: with yarn in back wyif: with yarn in front

yo: yarn over

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
