2 hanks #51136 Aurora (C1) and
1 hank #5112 Minty (C2)

HOOKS and NOTIONS
Crochet hooks, sizes H / 5 mm and
I / 5.5 mm or size to obtain gauge
Removable st marker (optional)

GAUGE
13 sts and 14 rows = 4" / 10 cm in
mosaic pattern stitch using larger
hook
*Gauge is measured after blocking.
To save time and ensure accurate
measurements, take time to check
gauge.*

CONSTRUCTION NOTES

Cowl is worked in one flat piece and then seamed. Ribbing is then added in the round. Pattern may be worked either from directions below or by following chart.

Mosaic Crochet is the art of making two-color patterns while only working with one color per row. This cowl uses the "overlay" mosaic crochet method, where on right-side rows, single crochet stitches are worked in the back loop, and double crochet stitches are worked in the front loops two rows below, so that the double crochets overlay the single crochets on the public-facing side of the fabric. On WS rows, the single crochets are worked in the front loops, and double crochets are worked in the back loop, so that the double crochets appear in the front on the right side of the fabric.

To work the mosaic crochet method employed here, you will turn the work every two rows, working across the RS with C1, then working across the RS with C2. Next, turn and work across the WS with C1, then work across the WS with C2. You may find it helpful to have a removable stitch marker to hold the live stitch of one color, while working the other.



SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Adc: Anchored Double Crochet: (RS): Dc into the front loop of the stitch 2 rows below, skipping the sc behind the stitch you are making.

Adc (WS): Dc into the back loop of the stitch 2 rows below, skipping the sc behind the stitch you are making.

COWL

Note: Except for the first and last st, scs are always worked in the back loop only on RS, and in the front loop only on WS.

With larger hook and C1, ch 32.

Row 1 (RS): With C1, ch 1, sc in both loops of 2nd ch from hook, sc in BLO of each ch to last ch, sc in both loops of last ch. Do not turn.

Row 2 (RS): Join C2 in first st, ch 1, sc in both loops of first sc, sc in BLO until last sc of row, sc in both loops of last sc, turn.

Row 3 (WS): With C1, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc,
 * [adc, sc in FLO of next st] twice, adc, sc in FLO of next 3 sts;
 rep from * to last 6 sts, [adc, sc] twice, adc, sc in both loops
 of last sc. Do not turn.

Row 4 (WS): With C2, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc, * sc in FLO of next 5 sts, 3 adc; rep from * to last 6 sts, sc in FLO of next 5 sts, sc in both loops of final sc, turn.

Row 5 (RS): With C1, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc, * [adc, sc in BLO of next st] twice, adc, sc in BLO of next 3 sts; rep from * to last 6 sts, [adc, sc in BLO of next st] twice, adc, sc in both loops of last sc. Do not turn.

Row 6 (RS): Rep Row 2.

Row 7 (WS): With C1, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc, adc,
* sc in FLO of next 3 sts, [adc, in FLO of next st] twice, adc;
rep from * to last 5 sts, sc in FLO of next 3 sts, adc, sc in both
loops of final sc. Do not turn.

Row 8 (WS): With C2, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc, sc in FLO of next st, * 3 adc, sc in FLO of next 5 sts; rep from * to last 5 sts, 3 adc, sc, sc in both loops of final sc, turn.

Row 9 (RS): With C1, ch 2, sc in both loops of first sc, adc,
* sc in BLO of next 3 sts, [adc, sc in BLO of next st] twice,
adc; rep from * to last 5 sts, sc in BLO of next 3 sts, adc, sc in
both loops of final sc. Do not turn.

Repeat Rows 2–9 eleven times more, fastening off C2 on last Row 8, and C1 on last Row 9.

FINISHING

With right sides together, fold cowl to align the short edges, join edges with a sc seam. Turn right-side out.

Ribbing: Using smaller crochet hook, join C1 at seam, ch 7.

Rnd 1 (RS): Sc in second ch from the hook, sc in each ch to end, sl st into edge of cowl, turn.

Rnd 2: Sc in first sc, sc in BLO in each sc to end, ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Sc in first sc, sc in BLO in each sc to end, sl st into edge of cowl, turn.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 until you have worked completely around the edge of cowl, end on Row 3, turn. Join ends of edging together with a sl st seam. Fasten off.

Repeat on other edge of cowl.

Weave in all ends and block as desired.

How to Read This Chart:

The **row numbers** on each side of the chart are color-coded to represent the color (C1 or C2) that is used for that row.

Squares with an X signify when to work adc, while empty spaces signify sc. Colored squares that are **not** in the same color as the row you are working show how the design will look **once completed**, after adc stitches are worked over them; they do not signify working with that color in the row you are working.

The chart does not include the edge stitches (1 st in sc on each side).

sliding loop: Form a loop of yarn around your fingers, with the end attached to the ball on the right and the tail on the left. Insert hook into the loop under both pieces of yarn and draw up a loop onto hook. (This does not count as your first stitch.) Work first row into the original loop. Pull up the yarn tail after your first row is complete to close the loop.

sp: space

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

tr: treble

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over
