(19, 20½)" / (48.5, 52) cm around x
(8, 9)" / (20.5, 23) cm high
Shown in smaller size.

YARN
BERROCO VINTAGE (100 grs): 1 hank
#5175 Fennel

NEEDLES and NOTIONS
16" / 40 cm circular needles, sizes 5
/ 3.75 mm and 7 / 4.5 mm *or size to
obtain gauge*
1 set double-pointed needles
(or preferred needles for working
small circumferences), size 7 /
4.5 mm
Stitch markers (1 a different color
for BOR)
Tapestry needle

GAUGE
20 sts and 32 rounds = 4" / 10 cm
in pattern stitch on larger needles
*Gauge is measured after blocking.
To save time and ensure accurate
measurements, take time to check
gauge.*

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We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this book are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. We cannot be responsible for variance of individual knitters, human or typographical errors.

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CONSTRUCTION NOTES

Hat is worked in the round from the bottom up.

HAT

Using smaller circular needle, cast on (96, 104) sts. Place BOR marker and join for working in the round.

Set Up Rib: Rnd 1: * K1, p1; rep from * around.

Work in ribbing as established until piece measures 2½" / 6.5 cm from cast-on. Change to larger needle.

Pattern Stitch: Rnd 1: Purl.

Rnd 2: Knit.

Rnd 3: Knit.

Rnd 4: * K2tog, yo; rep from * around.

Rep Rnds 1—4 until hat measures (4¼, 5¼)" / (10.5, 13.5) cm from cast-on, end on Rnd 2 of pattern.

Note: As you decrease for top, when there are too few stitches to fit comfortably on circular needle, change to dpns or preferred needles for working small circumferences in the round.

Shape Top: Dec Rnd 1: * K4, (k2tog) twice; rep from * around—(72, 78) sts.

Work Rnd 4 of pattern, then work 6 more rounds, end on Rnd 2 of pattern.

Dec Rnd 2: * K2, (k2tog) twice; rep from * around—(48, 52) sts.

Work Rnd 4 of pattern, then work 6 more rounds, end on Rnd 2 of pattern.



Dec Rnd 3: * K2tog; rep from * around—(24, 26) sts.
Work Rnd 4 of pattern, then work 6 more rounds, end on
Rnd 2 of pattern.
Dec Rnd 4: * K2tog; rep from * around—(12, 13) sts.

FINISHING

Break yarn leaving an 8" / 20 cm long end. Thread end into
tapestry needle and draw through all stitches on needles.
Pull up tightly and secure, then fasten off.



STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning
BOR: beginning of round
CC: contrasting color
CDD: Centered Double Decrease—Slip 2 together (as if to k2tog), knit 1, pass the 2 slipped stitches over
cn: cable needle
dec: decrease
dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)
end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row.
end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row
Garter St: Knit EVERY row when working back and forth in rows. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working in the round.
inc: increase
k: knit
k tbl: knit through the back loop(s)
k2tog: knit 2 stitches together
k3tog: knit 3 stitches together
kfb: knit in the front and back of the next st
LH: left hand
LLI: Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)
M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).
M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.
M1p: Make 1 purl—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).
M1pL: Make 1 purl Left—Work as for M1p.
M1pR: Make 1 purl Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).
M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).
MC: main color
p: purl
p tbl: purl through the back loop(s)
p2tog: purl 2 stitches together
p3tog: purl 3 stitches together
pat(s): pattern(s)
pm: place marker
psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat
Rev St st: Reverse Stockinette Stitch—Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round.
RH: right hand
RLI: Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)
rnd(s): round(s)
RS: right side
sl: slip
sm: slip marker
SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.
SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back loops.
SSSK: Slip 3 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 3 stitches and knit 3 together.
st(s): stitch(es)
St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.
tbl: through back loop(s)
w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.
WS: wrong side
wyib: with yarn in back
wyif: with yarn in front
yo: yarn over

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Hat: Approximately (18, 20)" /
(45.5, 51) cm around x (8½, 9½)" /
(21.5, 24) cm high
Shown in smaller size.

YARN

BERROCO VINTAGE (100 grs):
1 hank #5167 Dewberry

HOOKS and NOTIONS

Crochet hooks, sizes G / 4 mm and
H / 5 mm *or size to obtain gauge*
Tapestry needle

GAUGE

22 sc and 20 rows = 4" / 10 cm in
Ribbing using smaller hook
20 sts and 8 rounds = 4" / 10 cm in
Pattern st using larger hook
*Gauge is measured after blocking.
To save time and ensure accurate
measurements, take time to check
gauge.*

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CONSTRUCTION NOTES

Ribbing is worked flat in rows, then the ends are joined with a slip stitch. Stitches for body of hat are then worked around the upper long edge of ribbing.

HAT

Ribbing: With smaller hook, ch 15.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across—14 sc. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop of each sc across. Turn.

Rep Row 2 until you have worked a total of (90, 100) rows.

Joining Row: Fold ribbing in half so that ch edge is in back, parallel with working edge. Slip stitch in each sc from working edge together with one stitch from ch edge. Turn seam to the inside. Change to larger hook.

Note: The body of the hat is worked into the side edge of the ribbing. Work is turned at end of each round, so that rounds are worked alternating from the RS and WS.

Rnd 1: Ch 1 (counts as sc), sc in each row of ribbing, join with sl st in beg sc—(90, 100) sc. Turn.

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), * skip next sc, dc in next sc, ch 1; rep from * around, end with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. Turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), * skip next ch, dc in next dc, ch 1; rep from * around, end with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. Turn.



Rep Rnd 3 until hat measures approximately (6½, 7½)" / (16.5, 19) cm from lower edge of ribbing.

Shape Crown: Dec Rnd 1: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), [skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1] twice, skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between), ch 1, * [skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1] three times, skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between), ch 1 rep from * around. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch 4—(72, 80) sts. Turn.

Dec Rnd 2: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between), ch 1, * [skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1] twice, skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between), ch 1 rep from * rep from * around. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch 4—(54, 60) sts. Turn.

Dec Rnd 3: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between), ch 1, * skip next st, dc in next

st, ch 1, skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between, ch 1; rep from * around. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch 4—(36, 40) sts. Turn.

Dec Rnd 4: Ch 3, skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1, * skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between, ch 1; rep from * around. Join with sl st in 3rd ch—(18, 20) sts. Turn.

Dec Rnd 5: Ch 3, skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1, * skip next st, dc2tog (skipping one st in between, ch 1; rep from * around. Join with sl st in 3rd ch—(9, 10) sts. Turn.

Fasten off and break yarn, leaving an 8" / 20 cm end for closing top.

FINISHING

Use yarn end to stitch together top of hat, then weave in ends and block as desired.

ch: chain
dec: decrease
dc: double crochet
dc2tog: double crochet 2 stitches together
dtr: double treble crochet
est: established
FLO: front loop only
est: established
FP: front post
FPdc: front post double crochet
FPhdc: front post half double crochet
FPsc: front post single crochet
FPtc: front post treble crochet
hdc: half double crochet
hdc2tog: half double crochet 2 stitches together
inc: increase
MC: main color
pat(s): pattern(s)
pm: place marker
rep: repeat
rnd(s): round(s)
RS: right side
sc: single crochet
sc2tog: single crochet 2 stitches together
sl st: slip stitch

sliding loop: Form a loop of yarn around your fingers, with the end attached to the ball on the right and the tail on the left. Insert hook into the loop under both pieces of yarn and draw up a loop onto hook. (This does not count as your first stitch.) Work first row into the original loop. Pull up the yarn tail after your first row is complete to close the loop.

sp: space

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

tr: treble

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over

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
