

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SI7FS

(1, 2, 3, 4) [5, 6, 7] $\{8, 9, 10, 11\}$

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust (with buttonbands overlapped): (34½, 38¼, 42½, 46¼) [50½, 54¼, 58½] {62¼, 66½, 70¼, 74½}" / (87.5, 97, 108, 117.5) [128.5, 138, 148.5] {158, 169, 178.5, 189} cm

Length: (20¼, 20¾, 21, 21) [21½, 22, 22] {22½, 22½, 23, 23}" / (51.5, 52.5, 53.5, 53.5) [54.5, 56, 56] {57, 57, 58.5, 58.5} cm

Shown in size 4 ($46\frac{1}{4}$ " / 117.5 cm). Modeled with approximately 2" / 5 cm positive ease.

Recommended ease: 2–6" / 5–15 cm positive ease.

YARN

BERROCO AERIAL (25 g): (3, 4, 4, 4) [5, 5, 5] {6, 6, 7, 7} balls each #3455 Cherry, #3471 Fine Wine, and #3481 Firecracker **Note:** All 3 colors are held together throughout.

NEEDLES

32" / 80 cm circular needle, sizes 5 / 3.75 mm and 7 / 4.5 mm or *size to obtain gauge*

1 set each double-pointed needles, or preferred needles for working small circumferences, sizes 5 / 3% mm and 7 / 4.5 mm

NOTIONS

Stitch markers, seven 7/8" / 22 mm buttons, waste yarn to hold stitches, tapestry needle

GAUGE

19 sts and 29 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st on larger needles with 3 strands held together

Gauge is measured after blocking. To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

Berroco Aerial™



NOTE

This garment is worked in one piece from the neck down with three strands of yarn (one of each color) held together throughout. Yoke is shaped using short rows.

YOKE

With smaller 32" / 80 cm circular needle, cast (95, 97, 97, 97) [97, 101, 101] {101, 101, 105, 105} sts. Do not join.

Set Up Rib: Row 1 (WS): P1, * p1, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p2.



Row 2 (RS): K1, * k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 1" / 2.5 cm from cast-on edge, end after competing a RS row.

Change to larger 32" / 80 cm needle. Purl 1 row.

Shape Neck: Short Rows: Short Row 1 (RS): Knit (83, 84, 83, 83) [82, 85, 85] [84, 84, 87, 87], w&t.

Short Row 2 (WS): Purl (71, 71, 69, 69) [67, 69, 69] {67, 67, 69, 69}, w&t.

Short Row 3 (RS): Knit to wrapped stitch, knit wrapped stitch together with its wrap, k2, w&t.

Short Row 4 (WS): Purl to wrapped stitch, purl wrapped stitch together with its wrap, p2, w&t.

Rep Short Rows 3 and 4 twice more, end after competing a WS row.

Next Row (RS): Knit to end, knitting wrapped stitch together with its wrap.

Next Row (WS): Purl to end, purling wrapped stitch together with its wrap.

Inc Row 1 (RS): K1, * RLI, k2; rep from * to end. (142, 145, 145, 145) [145, 151, 151] {151, 151, 151, 157, 157} sts.

Work (5, 5, 5, 5) [5, 7, 7] {7, 7, 7, 7} rows even in St st, end after competing a WS row.

Inc Row 2 (RS): K3, * RLI, k3; rep from * to last st, k1. (188, 192, 192, 192) [192, 200, 200] {200, 200, 208, 208} sts.

Work 9 rows even in St st, end after competing a WS row.

Inc Row 3 (RS): K4, * RLI, k4; rep from * to end. (234, 239, 239, 239) [239, 249, 249] {249, 249, 259, 259} sts.

Work (9, 9, 9, 9) [9, 11, 11] {11, 11, 13, 13} rows even in St st, end after competing a WS row.

Inc Row 4 (RS): Knit (12, 14, 11, 17) [5, 12, 9] {6, 13, 14, 6}, * RLI, knit (21, 14, 7, 5) [4, 5, 3] {3, 2, 2, 2}; rep from * to last (12, 15, 11, 17) [6, 12, 9] {6, 14, 15, 7} sts, RLI, knit to end. (245, 255, 271, 281) [297, 295, 327] {329, 361, 375, 383} sts.

Work (16, 16, 14, 12) [16, 14, 14] {14, 14, 18, 14} rows even in St st, end after competing a RS row.

Next Row (Place Raglan Markers) (WS): Purl (34, 37, 41, 44) [49, 51, 57] {59, 65, 69, 73} for left front, pm, purl (53, 53, 55, 55) [55, 51, 57] {55, 61, 61, 59} for left sleeve, pm, purl (71, 75, 79, 83) [89, 91, 99] {101, 109, 115, 119} for back, pm, purl (53, 53, 55, 55) [55, 51, 57] {55, 61, 61, 59} for right sleeve, pm, purl to end for right front. 4 markers on needle.

Raglan Inc Row (RS): * Knit to 1 st before marker, LLI, k1, sm, k1, RLI, rep from * 3 times more, knit to end. 8 sts inc'd (2 at each raglan).

Working in St st, rep Raglan Inc Row every RS row (1, 3, 5, 6) [6, 7, 7] {8, 8, 7, 9} times more, end after competing a WS row. (261, 287, 319, 337) [353, 359, 391] {401, 433, 439, 463} sts; (36, 41, 47, 51) [56, 59, 65] {68, 74, 77, 83} sts for each front, (75, 83, 91, 97) [103, 107, 115] {119, 127, 131, 139} sts for back, and (57, 61, 67, 69) [69, 67, 73] {73, 79, 77, 79} sts for each sleeve.

Divide for Body and Sleeves: Next Row (RS): Knit to marker, remove marker, place (57, 61, 67, 69) [69, 67, 73] {73, 79, 77, 79} sts of left sleeve on waste yarn, cast on (5, 5, 5, 7) [9, 13, 13] {17, 17, 21, 21} sts, knit to next marker, remove marker, place (57, 61, 67, 69) [69, 67, 73] {73, 79, 77, 79} sts of right sleeve on waste yarn, cast on (5, 5, 5, 7) [9, 13, 13] {17, 17, 21, 21} sts, knit to end. (157, 175, 195, 213) [233, 251, 271] {289, 309, 327, 347} sts.

BODY

Beginning with a WS row, work even in St st until piece measures 9½" / 24 cm from dividing row, end after competing a WS row. Change to smaller needle.

Set Up Rib: Row 1 (RS): K1, * k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 2 (WS): P1, * p1, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p2. Rep Rows 1 and 2 until ribbing measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ " / 6.5 cm. Bind off in ribbing.

SLEEVES

With RS facing, slip (57, 61, 67, 69) [69, 67, 73] {73, 79, 77, 79} sleeve sts from waste yarn to larger circular needle. Beginning in center of cast-on stitches, pick up and knit (3, 3, 3, 4) [5, 7, 7] {9, 9, 11, 11} sts in cast-on stitches, knit (57, 61, 67, 69) [69, 67, 73] {73, 79, 77, 79} sts previously on waste yarn, then pick up and knit (2, 2, 2, 3) [4, 6, 6] {8, 8, 10, 10} sts in remaining cast-on stitches. (62, 66, 72, 76) [78, 80, 86] {90, 96, 98, 100} sts.

Divide stitches onto 3 larger dpns, place marker for BOR and join for working in the round. Work even in St st until sleeve measures 1" / 2.5 cm from dividing row.

Dec Rnd: K1, k2tog, knit to the last 2 sts, SSK. 2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec Rnd every (12, 10, 8, 8) [8, 8, 6] {6, 6, 6, 6} rounds (4, 5, 7, 7) [4, 7, 15] {11, 5, 5, 3} times more, then every (10, 8, 6, 6) [6, 6, 4] {4, 4, 4, 4} rounds (5, 6, 7, 7) [11, 7, 2] {8, 17, 17, 20} times more. (42, 42, 42, 46) [46, 50, 50] {50, 50, 52, 52} sts.

Work even in St st until sleeve measures $15\frac{1}{2}$ " / 39.5 cm from dividing row.

Change to smaller needles.

Set Up Rib: Rnd 1: * K1, p1; rep from * to end. Repeat this round until ribbing measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ " / 6.5 cm. Bind off in ribbing.

FINISHING

Left Button Band: With RS facing, using smaller circular needle, begin at top of neck, pick up and knit approximately 2 sts for every 3 rows down left front edge. Exact stitch count is not crucial, but must be an odd number. Work even in ribbing as for body for 10 rows. Bind off in ribbing.

Right Buttonhole Band: Place markers for 7 buttonholes along right front edge, each placed before a purl st, with the first 1" / 2.5 cm above lower edge, the last just below neckband, and the other 5 evenly spaced between. With RS facing, using smaller circular needle, begin at lower edge, pick up stitches as for left button band. Work even in ribbing for 5 rows, end after competing a WS row.

Buttonhole Row (RS): Work to first marker, yo, k2tog, * work to next marker, yo, k2tog; rep from * 5 times more, then work to end. *7 buttonholes made*.


Work even in ribbing for 4 rows more, end after competing a WS row.

Bind off in ribbing.

Weave in all ends and block as desired. Sew on buttons opposite buttonholes.

- **A** (Bust, not including button bands): (33, 36¾, 41, 44¾) [49, 52¾, 57] {60¾, 65, 68¾, 73}" / (84, 93.5, 104, 113.5) [124.5, 134, 145] {155, 165, 174.5, 185.5} cm
- **B** (Neck Circumference): (20, 20½, 20½, 20½) [20½, 21¼, 21¼] {21¼, 21¼, 22, 22}" / (51, 52, 52, 52) [52, 54, 54] {54, 54, 56, 56} cm
- C (Length to Underarms): 12" / 30.5 cm
- **D** (Yoke Length): (8¼, 8¾, 9, 9) [9½, 10, 10] {10½, 10½, 11, 11}" / (21, 22, 23, 23) [24, 25.5, 25.5] {26.5, 26.5, 28, 28} cm
- **E** (Sleeve Cuff Circumference): (8¾, 8¾, 8¾, 9¾) [9¾, 10½, 10½] {10½, 10½, 11, 11}" / (22, 22, 22, 25) [25, 26.5, 26.5, 26.5, 28, 28}cm
- **F** (Upper Sleeve Circumference): (13, 14, 15¼, 16) [16½, 16¾, 18] {19, 20¼, 20¾, 21}" / (33, 35.5, 38.5, 40.5) [42, 42.5, 45.5] {48.5, 51.5, 52.5, 53.5} cm
- G (Sleeve Length): 18" / 45.5 cm

STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning

BOR: beginning of round

dec: decrease

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

inc: increasek: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

LLI: Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

p: purlrep: repeat

RLI: Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1

st inc'd)

rnd(s): round(s)RS: right side

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.

WS: wrong side
