SIZES

Child's sizes 2 (4, 6, 8, 10) Shown in Size 8.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Chest: 25 (27, 29, 31, 33)" Length: 13¾ (16¼, 18¼, 19¾, 21¼)" Note: When measuring length of Pattern Stitch section, measure to the lowest point of scalloped caston edge.

YARN

BERROCO REMIX (100 grs): 2 (2, 2, 3, 3) balls #3977 Pool

NEEDLES and NOTIONS

29" circular needles, sizes 101/2 (6.50 mm), 10 (6.00 mm), 9 (5.50 mm), and 8 (5.00 mm), or sizes to obtain gauge 16" circular needle, size 8 (5.00 mm) 1 set double-pointed needles, size 8 (5.00 mm) 1 stitch marker 2 stitch holders or waste yarn to hold stitches

GAUGE

17 sts and 23 rnds = 4" in St st on size 8 (5.00 mm) needle 17 sts and 24 rnds = 4" in Pattern Stitch on size 9 (5.50 mm) needle 16 sts and 21 rnds = 4" in Pattern Stitch on size 10 (6.00 mm) needle 15 sts and 20 rnds = 4" in Pattern Stitch on size 10½ (6.50 mm) needle

To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

NOTE

Body and sleeves are made separately in the round, then joined at underarm to work yoke in the round.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

MB (Make Bobble): [P1, yo, p1] all in next stitch – 3 stitches made from 1

PATTERN STITCH

Multiple of 12 sts Rnds 1 and 2: Knit.

Rnd 3: * (K2tog) twice, (yo, k1) 4 times, (k2tog) twice, rep

from * around. Rnd 4: Knit.

Rep these 4 rounds for Pattern Stitch.

BODY

With size 10½ needle, cast on 108 (120, 132, 144, 144) sts. Place marker and join for working in the round. [Knit 1 round, purl 1 round] twice. Work even in Pattern Stitch until piece measures 3 (3½, 4, 4½, 4¾)" from beginning. Change to size 10 needle and work even in Pattern Stitch until piece measures 7 (7, 8, 9, 9½)" from beginning. Change to size 9 needle and work even in Pattern Stitch until piece measures 9 (11, 12½, 13½, 14½)" from beginning. Change to size 8 needle.

Dec Rnd: Knit, dec 2 (6, 8, 12, 4) sts evenly spaced around—106 (114, 124, 132, 140) sts. Knit 1 round, end 3 sts before the end of round.


Divide for Back and Front: Next Rnd: Bind off 6 sts, removing marker, k47 (51, 56, 60, 64) for front, bind off 6 sts, k47 (51, 56, 60, 64) for back—47 (51, 56, 60, 64) sts each for both back and front sections. Do not break off yarn. Leave sts on needle for yoke and set aside.

SLEEVES (Make 2)

With dpns, cast on 38 (42, 46, 50, 56) sts. Place marker and join for working in the round, dividing stitches onto 3 needles. (Knit 1 round, purl 1 round) twice. Work even in St st (knit EVERY round) until sleeve measures 4" from

beginning, ending 3 sts before end of last round.

Shape Underarm: Next Rnd: Bind off 6 sts, removing marker, knit to end—32 (36, 40, 44, 50) sts. Slip stitches to waste yarn for yoke.

YOKE

Note: When there are too few stitches to fit comfortably on longer circular needle, change to shorter circular needle. Joining Rnd: With longer size 8 needle, k32 (36, 40, 44, 50) sts of left sleeve, 47 (51, 56, 60, 64) sts of front, 32 (36, 40, 44, 50) sts of left sleeve, then 47 (51, 56, 60, 64) sts of back—158 (174, 192, 208, 228) sts. Place marker and join for working in the round.

Dec Rnd 1: [K5 (4, 4, 4, 3), k2tog] 18 (29, 18, 30, 6) times, then [k6 (0, 5, 5, 4), k2tog] 4 (0, 12, 4, 33) times—136 (145, 162, 174, 189) sts. Knit 7 (8, 9, 10, 11) rounds.

Dec Rnd 2: [K4 (3, 3, 3, 2), k2tog] 18 (5, 18, 30, 6) times, then [k5 (4, 4, 4, 3), k2tog] 4 (20, 12, 4, 33) times—114 (120, 132, 140, 150) sts. Knit 7 (8, 9, 10, 11) rounds.

Dec Rnd 3: [K3 (2, 2, 2, 1), k2tog] 18 (5, 18, 30, 6) times, then [k4 (3, 3, 3, 2), k2tog] 4 (20, 12, 4, 33) times—92 (95, 102, 106, 111) sts. Knit 7 (8, 9, 10, 11) rounds.

Dec Rnd 4: [K2 (1, 1, 1, 0), k2tog] 18 (5, 18, 30, 6) times, then [k3 (2, 2, 2, 1), k2tog] 4 (20, 12, 4, 33) times—70 (70, 72, 72, 72) sts.

Neckband: Rnd 1: * P1, MB, rep from * around.

Rnd 2: Purl.

Rnd 1: * P1, p3tog, rep from * around.

Bind off purlwise.

FINISHING

Sew bound-off stitches at underarms together. Weave in all ends and block as desired.

LLI: Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.

M1p: Make 1 purl—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1pL: Make 1 purl Left—Work as for M1p.

M1pR: Make 1 purl Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

MC: main color

p: purl

p tbl: purl through the back loop(s) p2tog: purl 2 stitches together p3tog: purl 3 stitches together

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat

Rev St st: Reverse Stockinette Stitch—Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round.

RH: right hand

RLI: Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

rnd(s): round(s) RS: right side

sl: slip

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2

SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back

SSSK: Slip 3 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 3 stitches and knit 3 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

tbl: through back loop(s)

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.

WS: wrong side

wyib: with yarn in back wyif: with yarn in front

yo: yarn over

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
