FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Completed Blanket: Approximately 52" x 64" /
132 cm x 163 cm

Each Block: Approximately 12" / 30.5 cm square

YARN

BERROCO VINTAGE (100 g): 6 hanks of C1, 4 hanks of C2,
3 hanks each of C3 and C4, and 2 hanks of C5.

Sample colors shown: #5101 Mochi (C1), #5172 Calico
(C2), #51198 (C3), #5105 Oats (C4), #51183 Twilight (C5)

NEEDLES

See individual block patterns for needle sizes; most
blocks can be worked on straight or any length circular
needles, sizes 7 / 4.5 mm (smaller needle) and 8 / 5 mm
(larger needle) *or sizes to obtain gauge for each block; see
below for general gauge guideline.*

A few blocks are made in the round, and require double-
pointed needles (dpns), or preferred needles for working
small circumferences.

Edgings will require a long circular needle (smaller size).

NOTIONS

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, cable needle (cn)

GAUGE

Each block has its own gauge. However, to determine
which sizes to use for your smaller and larger size
needles, use the ball band gauges for Vintage:

Gauge #1: 20 sts and 27 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using
smaller needle

Gauge #2: 18 sts and 24 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using
larger needle

*Gauge is measured after blocking. To save time and ensure
accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.*

NOTE

Minor variations in block size—within about 1" / 2.5 cm
in either direction—are okay. Once the blocks are all
sewn together, these differences won't be noticeable.

BLOCK #6–Lace

Designed by Nadia Glaser / Skill Level: Easy



NEEDLES

Knitting needles, size 8 / 5 mm (larger needles) or size to obtain gauge

GAUGE

16 sts and 24 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Pattern St

SKILLS USED

Yarn over, decreases (SSK, k2tog, CDD).
Optional: reading charts.

BLOCK #6 INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 51 sts with C5.

Purl 1 row, knit 1 row, purl 1 row.

Note: Work Lace Pattern either from written directions or following chart.

Lace Pattern: Row 1 (RS): K2, * yo, k1, SSK, k9, k2tog, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 and all even rows (WS): Purl.

Row 3: K2, * k1, yo, k1, SSK, k7, k2tog, k1, yo, k2; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 5: K2, * k2, yo, k1, SSK, k5, k2tog, k1, yo, k3; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 7: K2, * k3, yo, k1, SSK, k3, k2tog, k1, yo, k4; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 9: K2, * k4, yo, k1, SSK, k1, k2tog, k1, yo, k5; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 11: K2, * k5, yo, k1, CDD, k1, yo, k6; rep from * to last st, k1.

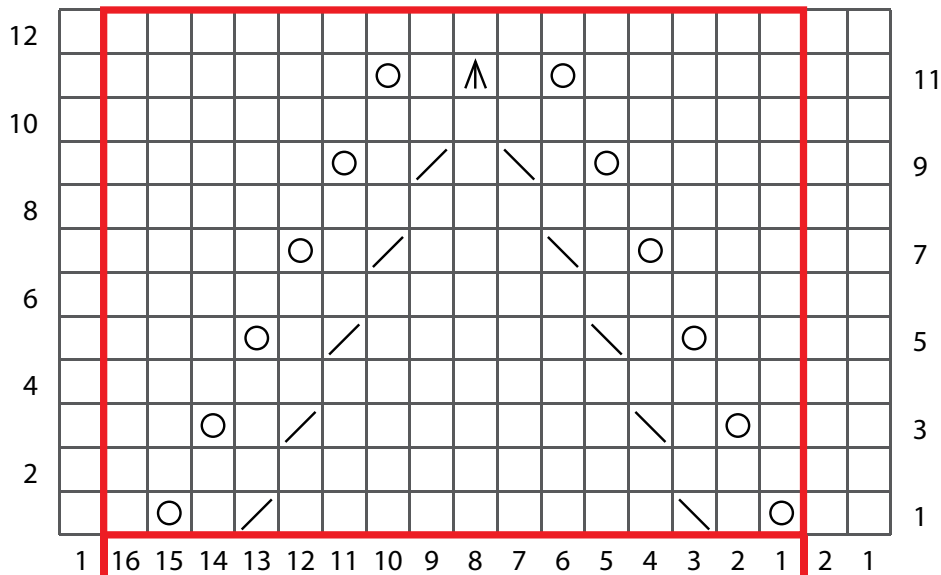
Row 12: Purl.

Rep Rows 1–12 five times more.

Knit 1 RS row.

Bind off purlwise on WS.

knit on RS; purl on WS

yarn over

k2tog

SSK

CDD

pattern repeat

CHART NOTES

Work from right to left on RS rows
and from left to right on WS rows.

BLOCK #7–Lace

Designed by Alison Green / Skill level: Intermediate



NEEDLES

1 set double-pointed needles, or preferred needles for working small circumferences, size 8 / 5 mm (larger needles) *or size to obtain gauge*

16" / 40 cm and 24" / 60 cm circular needles, size 8 / 5 mm (larger needles) *or size to obtain gauge*

Crochet hook, size H-8 / 5 mm *or same size as knitting needles*

NOTIONS

4 stitch markers (1 a different color for BOR)

GAUGE

13½ sts and 16 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Pattern St using larger needles

SKILLS USED

Emily Ocker's circular cast-on, knit stitch, yarn over, decreases (k2tog, SSK, "sl 1, k2tog, pssso," k3tog), working small circumferences in the round.

Optional: reading charts.

BLOCK #7 INSTRUCTIONS

With C2, use Emily Ocker's circular cast-on to cast on 8 sts as follows: Make a loop around your finger. * Using crochet hook, insert hook in the loop on your finger and pull up a loop on the hook. Yo and draw through the loop on your hook. 1 stitch made. Repeat from * until you have made 8 sts. Divide stitches onto 3 dpns or preferred needle(s) for working small circumferences, placing markers every 2 stitches and placing BOR marker after last stitch. Join for working in the round.

Notes: Work from directions below or follow chart. Chart will be worked 4 times around. If desired, you can work one plain knit round before beginning Rnd 1.

When there are too many stitches to fit comfortably on dpns, change to shorter circular needle, then when there are too many stitches to fit comfortably on shorter circular needle, change to longer circular needle.

Rnd 1: * Yo, k1; rep from * around. 16 sts.

Rnd 2 and all even-numbered rounds: Knit.

Rnd 3: * Yo, k3, yo, k1; rep from * around. 24 sts.

Rnd 5: * Yo, k5, yo, k1; rep from * around. 32 sts.

Rnd 7: * Yo, k7, yo, k1; rep from * around. 40 sts.

Rnd 9: * Yo, k9, yo, k1; rep from * around. 48 sts.

Rnd 11: * Yo, k1, yo, SSK, k5, k2tog, [yo, k1] twice; rep from * around. 56 sts.

Rnd 13: * Yo, k3, yo, SSK, k3, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, k1; rep from * around. 64 sts.

Rnd 15: * Yo, k5, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, k1; rep from * around. 72 sts.

Rnd 17: * Yo, k7, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k7, yo, k1; rep from * around. 80 sts.

Rnd 19: * Yo, k9, yo, SSK, k8, yo, k1; rep from * around. 88 sts.

Rnd 21: * Yo, k1, yo, SSK, k5, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, k5, k2tog, [yo, k1] twice; rep from * around. 96 sts.

Rnd 23: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, k3, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, yo, SSK, k3, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, yo, k1; rep from * around. 104 sts.

Rnd 25: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, yo, SSK, yo, k1; rep from * around. 112 sts.

Rnd 27: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, k1; rep from * around. 120 sts.

Rnd 29: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, SSK, yo, k3tog, yo, k5, yo, SSK, yo, k3tog, yo, k5, yo, SSK, yo, k1; rep from * around. 128 sts.

Rnd 31: * Yo, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, yo, k1; rep from * around. 136 sts.

Rnd 33: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, [yo k2tog] twice, yo, k1, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, [yo, k2tog] twice, yo, k1, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, [yo, k2tog] twice, [yo, k1] twice; rep from * around. 144 sts.

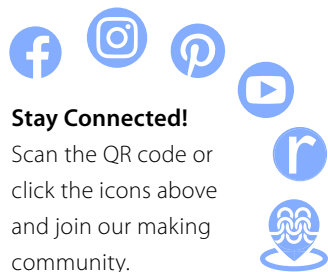
Rnd 35: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, [yo, SSK] twice, k1, [k2tog, yo] twice, k1, yo, SSK, yo, k1; rep from * around. 152 sts.

Rnd 37: * Yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SSK, yo, k1; rep from * around. 160 sts.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Pull sliding loop at center tight and secure. Weave in all ends and block as desired.



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STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

BOR: beginning of round

CDD: Centered Double Decrease—Slip 2 together (as if to k2tog), knit 1, pass the 2 slipped stitches over

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

k: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

k3tog: knit 3 stitches together

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

WS: wrong side

BLOCK 7 LACE CHART

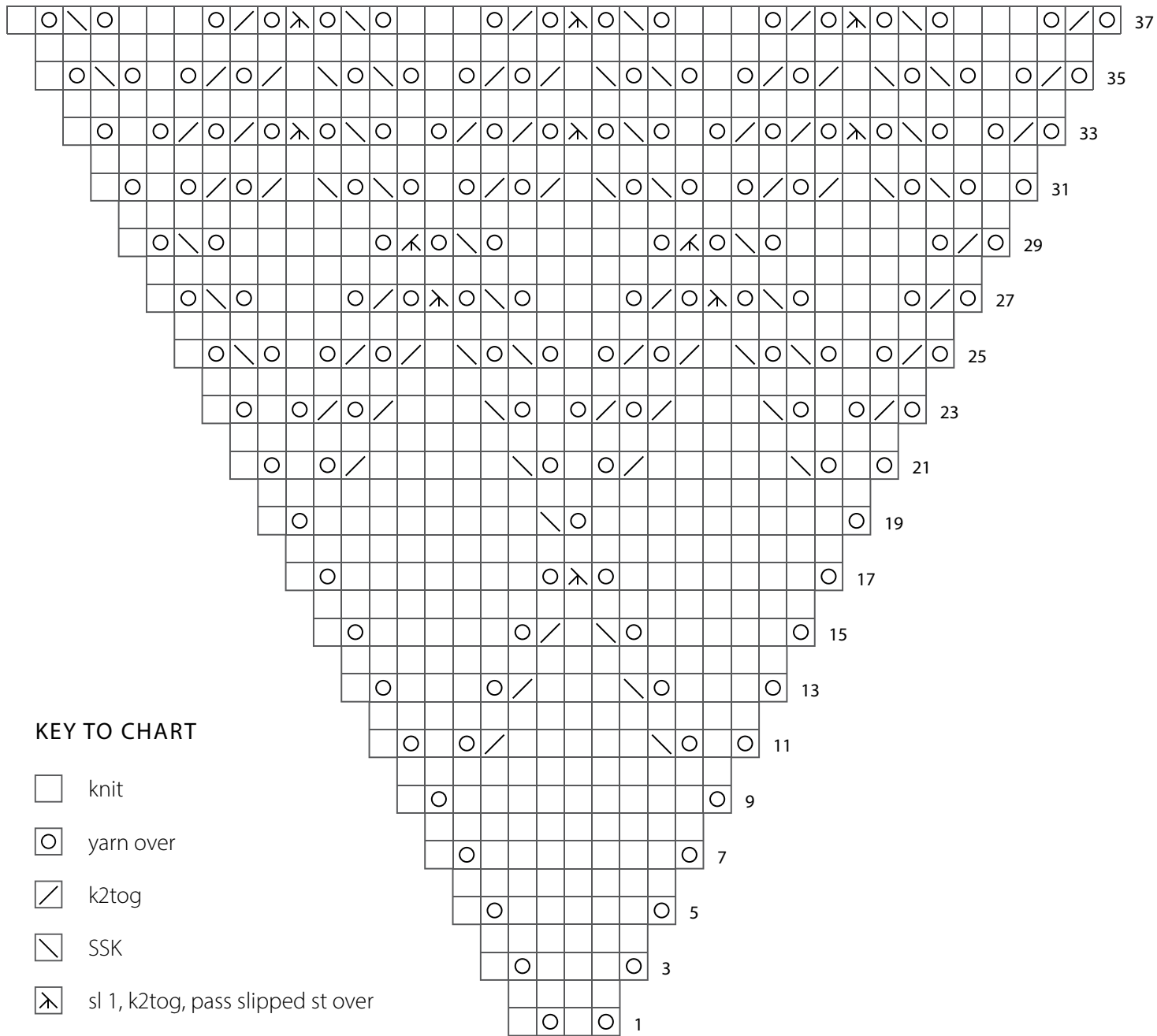


CHART NOTES

Work from right to left on every round,
repeating the chart 4 times on each round.
