FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Completed Blanket: Approximately 52" x 64" /
132 cm x 163 cm

Each Block: Approximately 12" / 30.5 cm square

YARN

BERROCO VINTAGE (100 g): 6 hanks of C1, 4 hanks of C2,
3 hanks each of C3 and C4, and 2 hanks of C5.
Sample colors shown: #5101 Mochi (C1), #5172 Calico
(C2), #51198 (C3), #5105 Oats (C4), #51183 Twilight (C5)

NEEDLES

See individual block patterns for needle sizes; most
blocks can be worked on straight or any length circular
needles, sizes 7 / 4.5 mm (smaller needle) and 8 / 5 mm
(larger needle) *or sizes to obtain gauge for each block; see
below for general gauge guideline.*

A few blocks are made in the round, and require double-
pointed needles (dpns), or preferred needles for working
small circumferences.

Edgings will require a long circular needle (smaller size).

NOTIONS

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, cable needle (cn)

GAUGE

Each block has its own gauge. However, to determine
which sizes to use for your smaller and larger size
needles, use the ball band gauges for Vintage:

Gauge #1: 20 sts and 27 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using
smaller needle

Gauge #2: 18 sts and 24 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using
larger needle

*Gauge is measured after blocking. To save time and ensure
accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.*

NOTE

Minor variations in block size—within about 1" / 2.5 cm
in either direction—are okay. Once the blocks are all
sewn together, these differences won't be noticeable.

BLOCK #3–Striped

Designed by Brenda York / Skill Level: Easy



NEEDLES

24" / 60 cm and 16" / 40 cm circular needles, size 7 / 4.5 mm (smaller needle) *or size to obtain gauge*

1 set double-pointed needles, or preferred needles for working small circumferences, size 7 / 4.5 mm (smaller needle)

NOTIONS

4 stitch markers (1 a different color for BOR), and tapestry needle

GAUGE

20 sts and 27 rnds = 4" / 10 cm in St st

SKILLS USED

Casting on, knit stitch, working small circumferences in the round, decreasing stitches (k2tog and SSK).

CONSTRUCTION NOTE

This block is worked in the round from the outside edge to the center. There are six versions, changing the colors used for each. The completed blanket includes all six iterations.

BLOCK 3A INSTRUCTIONS

With longer circular needle, using C2, * cast on 54 sts, pm; rep from * twice more, cast on 54 sts, place BOR marker and join for working in the round. 216 sts.

Note: As you decrease, when there are too few stitches to fit comfortably on longer circular needle, change to shorter circular needle. When there are too few stitches to fit comfortably on shorter circular needle, change to dpns, dividing stitches onto 3–4 needles, or preferred needle(s) for working small circumferences.

Border: Rnd 1: Knit, slipping markers.

Rnd 2 (Dec Rnd): * K1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before next marker, SSK, k1, sm; rep from * 3 times more. 8 sts dec'd.

Rnd 3 (Dec Rnd): Rep Rnd 2. 8 sts dec'd.

Rep Rnds 1–3 once more, then rep Rnds 1 and 2 once more. 176 sts.

Change to C3.

Middle Section: Work Rnd 3, rep Rnds 1–3 six times more, then work Rnd 1 once more. 72 sts.

Change to C1.

Center: Rep Rnd 2 seven times. 16 sts.

Next Rnd: * K2tog, SSK, sm; rep from * 3 times more. 8 sts.

Break yarn, leaving end approximately 10" / 25 cm long. Thread end into tapestry needle and draw through all stitches on needles. Pull up tightly and secure, then fasten off.



BLOCK 3B INSTRUCTIONS

Work as for Block 3A, casting on and working Border using C4. When Border is completed, change to C1 for Middle Section, then change to C3 for center.



BLOCK 3E INSTRUCTIONS

Work as for Block 3A, casting on and working Border using C3. When Border is completed, change to C2 for Middle Section, then change to C4 for center.



BLOCK 3C INSTRUCTIONS

Work as for Block 3A, casting on and working Border using C1. When Border is completed, change to C3 for Middle Section, then change to C2 for center.



BLOCK 3F INSTRUCTIONS

Work as for Block 3A, casting on and working Border using C2. When Border is completed, change to C1 for Middle Section, then change to C3 for center.



BLOCK 3D INSTRUCTIONS

Work as for Block 3A, casting on and working Border using C2. When Border is completed, change to C4 for Middle Section, then change to C5 for center.

STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

dec: decrease

k: knit

k2tog: knit 2 sts together

p: purl

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

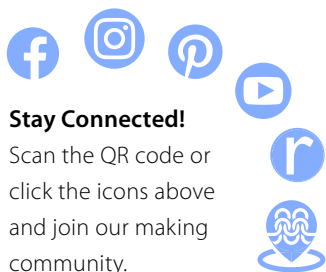
RS: right side

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

WS: wrong side



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
