FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Completed Blanket: Approximately 52" x 64" / 132 cm x 163 cm

Each Block: Approximately 12" / 30.5 cm square

YARN

BERROCO VINTAGE (100 g): 6 hanks of C1, 4 hanks of C2, 3 hanks each of C3 and C4, and 2 hanks of C5.

Sample colors shown: #5101 Mochi (C1), #5172 Calico (C2), #51198 (C3), #5105 Oats (C4), #51183 Twilight (C5)

NEEDLES

See individual block patterns for needle sizes; most blocks can be worked on straight or any length circular needles, sizes 7 / 4.5 mm (smaller needle) and 8 / 5 mm (larger needle) or sizes to obtain gauge for each block; see below for general gauge guideline.

A few blocks are made in the round, and require double-pointed needles (dpns), or preferred needles for working small circumferences.

Edgings will require a long circular needle (smaller size).

NOTIONS

Stitch markers, tapesty needle, cable needle (cn)

GAUGE

Each block has its own gauge. However, to determine which sizes to use for your smaller and larger size needles, use the ball band gauges for Vintage:

Gauge #1: 20 sts and 27 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using smaller needle

Gauge #2: 18 sts and 24 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st using larger needle

Gauge is measured after blocking. To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

NOTE

Minor variations in block size—within about 1" / 2.5 cm in either direction—are okay. Once the blocks are all sewn together, these differences won't be noticeable.

BLOCK #4-Texture



NEEDLES

Knitting needles, size 8 / 5 mm (largerer needles) or size to obtain gauge

GAUGE

17 sts and 27 rows = 4" / 10 cm in pattern stitch using larger needles

SKILLS USED

Cast on, knit stitch, purl stitch, slip stitch, bind off.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Lst: Lift strand. Insert right needle under loose strand from front to back and knit next stitch, lifting stitch in front of strand. As the stitch is completed, lift the strand over the stitch.

SI 1 wyif: Slip 1 stitch purlwise with yarn in front of work

BLOCK #4 INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 51 sts.

Set Up: Row 1 (WS): K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Next Row: Knit.

Begin Working in Pattern St as follows:

Row 1 (WS): K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Row 2: (RS): K2, * [sl 1 wyif] 3 times, k1; rep from * to last stitch, k1.

Row 3: K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Row 4: K2, * k1, Lst, k2; rep from * to last stitch, k1.

Row 5: K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Row 6: K4, * [sl 1 wyif] 3 times, k1; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 7: K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Row 8: K4, * k1, Lst, k2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Repeat Rows 1–8 of Pattern Stitch ten times more.

Next Row (WS): K1, purl to last stitch, k1.

Next Row (RS): Knit.

Bind off purlwise.

BLOCK #5—Intarsia



NEEDLES

Knitting needles, size 8 / 5 mm (larger needles) or size to obtain gauge

GAUGE

18 sts and 24 rows = 4" / 10 cm in St st following chart

SKILLS USED

Casting on, knit stitch, purl stitch, changing colors (intarsia), binding off.

Note: When working chart, to change colors, hold yarn to the left and pick up new color from underneath to prevent holes.







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BLOCK #5 INSTRUCTIONS

With C3, cast on 57 sts. Beginning with a purl row, work 4 rows in St st, then follow chart until Row 63 has been completed. Work even with C2 until block measures 12" / 30.5 cm.

Bind off.

STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

k: knit

p: purl

rep: repeatRS: right side


sl: slip

st(s): stitch(es)

C1 Work from right to left on RS rows and from left to right on WS rows. Work in St st throughout (knit on RS, purl on WS). Numbers within the chart indicate the number of sts worked in that color section.
