FINISHED MEASUREMENTS Approximately 24 (28, 32)" across back and front x 28 (29, 30)" long Shown in size 24".

YARN

BERROCO REMIX LIGHT (100 grs): 3 (4, 4) balls #6984 Ocean

NEEDLES and NOTIONS 29" circular needles, sizes 3 (3.25 mm), 5 (3.75 mm) and 9 (5.50 mm) or size to obtain gauge 16" circular needle, size 3 (3.25 mm) 2 stitch markers

GAUGE

23 sts and 26 rows = 4" in Pattern Stitch

To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

PATTERN STITCH

Row 1 (RS): With middle-sized needle, knit. Row 2 (WS): With largest needle, purl tbl. Rep these 2 rows for Pattern Stitch.

BACK

With largest 29" needle, cast on 62 (86, 108) sts. Do not join. Purl 1 WS row. Working in Pattern Stitch, inc 1 st each side EVERY row 14 times, then every RS row 24 times— 138 (162, 184) sts. Work even until piece measures 14" from beginning, end on WS. Mark beginning and end of last row for beginning of armholes.

Shape Raglan Armholes: Dec Row 1 (RS): K3, k2tog, work to last 5 sts, SSK, k3—2 sts dec'd.

Dec Row 2 (WS): P3, p2tog, work to last 5 sts, SSP, p3— 2 sts dec'd. Rep these 2 rows 12 (21, 29) times more, then rep Dec Row 1 every RS row 20 (14, 9) times, end on WS. AT THE SAME TIME, when armholes measure 9 (10, 11)" (before all decs have been completed), end on WS. Mark center 40 sts on last row.

Shape Neck: Next Row (RS): Continuing to work armhole decs, work to first marker, join another hank of yarn and bind off center 40 sts, removing markers, work to end. Working both sides at once, continue to work armhole decs as before and AT THE SAME TIME, dec 1 st at each neck edge EVERY row twice. Note: When there are too few sts to work the raglan decreases 3 sts from the edge, move them closer to the edge as needed. When all decs have been completed, fasten off last st each side.

FRONT

Work as for back.

SLEEVES

With smallest needle (either length), cast on 46 (58, 70) sts. Do not join.

Set Up Rib: Row 1 (RS): K2, * p2, k2, rep from * across. **Row 2:** P2, * k2, p2, rep from * across. Rep these 2 rows until sleeve measures 5" from beginning, end on RS. Change to largest needle and purl the next row. Work even in Pattern Stitch until sleeve measures 7" from





beginning, end on WS. Mark beginning and end of last row for beginning of raglan sleeve cap.

Shape Raglan Sleeve Cap: Dec Row (RS): K3, k2tog, knit to last 5 sts, SSK, k2—2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec row every 14th (6th, 4th) row 3 (9, 13, then every 14th (8th, 6th) row 2 (2, 4) times more. AT THE SAME TIME, when sleeve measures 16 (17, 18)" from beginning (before all decs have been completed), end on WS. Mark center 28 sts.


Shape Top: Next Row (RS): Continuing to work side decs, work to first marker, join another hank of yarn and bind off center 28 sts, work to end. Working both sides at once, continue to work side decs as before and AT THE SAME TIME, dec 1 st at each side of bound-off sts every RS row twice. Note: When there are too few sts to work the raglan decreases 3 sts from the edge, move them closer to the edge as needed. When all decs have been completed, fasten off last st each side. When all decs have been completed, fasten off last st on each side.

FINISHING

Lower Edging: With RS facing, using smallest 29" needle, begin at left armhole marker, pick up and knit approximately 2 sts for every 3 rows along left side edge of back, 1 st in every cast-on stitch, then 2 sts for every 3 rows along right side edge of back, ending with a multiple of 4 sts + 2. Beginning with Row 2, work in ribbing as for sleeves for 2", end on WS. Bind off in ribbing. Work same edging along lower edge of front. Sew raglan sleeve caps to raglan armholes matching armhole markers at beginning of lower edging with markers on sleeves. Bound-off edges of lower edging should be even with the top of sleeve ribbing. Sew ribbing together at sleeve cuffs.



Neckband: With RS facing, using 16" needle, begin at back left shoulder seam, pick up and knit 148 sts around entire neck edge. Place marker and join for working in the round. Work even in k2, p2 ribbing for ¾". Bind off in ribbing. Weave in all ends and block as desired.



STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning

CC: contrasting color

CDD: Centered Double Decrease—Slip 2 together (as if to k2tog), knit 1, pass the 2 slipped stitches over

cn: cable needle

dec: decrease

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row. end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row Garter St: Knit EVERY row when working back and forth

in rows. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working in the round.

inc: increase

k: knit

k tbl: knit through the back loop(s)

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

k3tog: knit 3 stitches together

kfb: knit in the front and back of the next st **LH:** left hand

LLI: Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.

M1p: Make 1 purl—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1pL: Make 1 purl Left—Work as for M1p.

M1pR: Make 1 purl Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

MC: main color

p: purl

p tbl: purl through the back loop(s)
p2tog: purl 2 stitches together
p3tog: purl 3 stitches together
pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch **rep:** repeat

Rev St st: Reverse Stockinette Stitch—Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round.

RH: right hand

RLI: Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

sl: slip

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back loops.

SSSK: Slip 3 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 3 stitches and knit 3 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

tbl: through back loop(s)

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.
