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SIZES

(1, 2, 3) [4, 5, 6, 7] {8, 9, 10}

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust: (36, 40, 44) [48, 52, 56, 60] {64, 68, 72}" / (91.5, 101.5, 112) [122, 132, 142, 152.5] {162.5, 172.5, 183} cm

Length: (21¼, 22¼, 23¾) [24, 25¼, 25½, 25] {25¼, 26½, 27¾}" / (54, 56.5, 60.5) [61, 64, 65, 63.50 {64, 67.5, 70} cm

Shown in size 3 (44" / 112 cm). Recommended ease: Approximately 2–6" / 5–15 cm positive ease

YARN

BERROCO VINTAGE HANDPAINT (100 g): (4, 5, 5) [6, 7, 7, 8] {8, 9, 10} hanks #5210 Teal Horizon

NEEDLES and NOTIONS

16" / 40 cm and 32" / 80 cm circular needles, sizes 6 / 4 mm and 7 / 4.5 mm *or size to obtain gauge*

2 st markers (2 different colors), waste yarn to hold sts

GAUGE

20 sts and 28 rnds = 4" / 10 cm in St st using larger needle

Gauge is measured after blocking. To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

SPECIAL TERMS

Sewn Tubular Bind Off

Break off yarn leaving a tail several yds long. Thread tail into tapestry needle.

- 1. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the needle as if to purl, pull the yarn through.
- 2. Insert the tapestry needle between the first and second stitches on the needle from back to front, and into the second stitch on the needle as if to knit, pull the yarn through.
- **3.** Insert the tapestry needle as if to knit into the first stitch, dropping the stitch off the end of the needle, and purl wise into the new second stitch on the needle (the st you have not gone through at all yet).
- **4.** Insert the needle into the first stitch on the needle as if to knit, and drop it off the needle. Pull the yarn through.

Rep Steps 2-4 until all the stitches have been bound off.

CONSTRUCTION NOTES

This garment is worked seamlessly in the round from the neck down.

INSTRUCTIONS

Collar: With smaller 16" / 40 cm needle, cast on (120, 120, 120) [128, 128, 136, 136] {144, 144, 144} sts. Place marker and join for working in the round. Work even in k1, p1 ribbing for 10" / 25.5 cm.

Next Rnd: Work (60, 60, 60) [64, 64, 68, 68] {72, 72, 72} sts, pm, work to end— there is now a marker at each side edge.

Change to larger 16" / 40 cm needle.

Note: As you increase, when there are too many stitches to fit comfortably on larger 16" / 40 cm needle, change to larger 32" / 80 cm needle.

Shape Shoulders: Rnd 1 (Inc Rnd): * K1, p1, k1, M1R, k1, M1R, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1L, k1, M1L, k1, p1, sm; rep from * to end. 8 sts inc'd.

Rnd 2: * K1, p1, knit to 1 st before next marker, p1, sm; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rounds (7, 9, 12) [13, 16, 17, 20] {21, 24, 26} times more. *(184, 200, 224) [240, 264, 280, 304] {320, 344, 360} sts.*

Divide for Back and Front: Next Rnd: Remove marker, bind off 1 st, knit to next marker, leave (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151] {159, 171, 179} sts just worked on larger 32"/ 80 cm needle for front; remove marker, using larger 16" / 40 cm needle, bind off 1 st, knit to end. (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151] {159, 171, 179} sts.

BACK

Using larger 16" / 40 cm needle, beginning with a purl row, work back and forth in St st until piece measures (7, 7½, 8) [8, 8½, 8½, 9] {9, 9½, 10}" / (18, 19, 20.5) [20.5, 21.5, 21.5, 23] {23, 24, 25.5} cm from dividing rnd, end after completing a WS row. Break off yarn and leave sts on needle.

FRONT

Join yarn to first st on WS of longer gauge needle and, beginning with a purl row, work back and forth in St st until piece measures same as Back, end after completing a WS row.

Joining Rnd: With longer, larger needle, knit (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151] {159, 171, 179} sts of Front, then knit (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151] {159, 171, 179} sts of back. *(182, 198, 222) [238, 262, 278, 302] {318, 342, 358} sts*.



BODY

Place marker for BOR and work even in St st (knit every rnd) until piece measures (9, 9, 9) [9, 9, 9, 7] {7, 7, 7}" / (23, 23, 23) [23, 23, 23, 18] {18, 18, 18} cm from Joining Rnd.

Change to smaller 32" / 80 cm needle and remove marker.

Divide for Split Hem: Next Row (RS): K1, * p1, k1; rep from * until there are (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151] {159, 171, 179} sts on RH needle for Front, slip remaining stitches to waste yarn for Back.

Front Hem: Work even in ribbing as established for 3" / 7.5 cm, end after completing a WS row. Bind off using sewn tubular bind-off.

Back Hem: With RS facing, slip (91, 99, 111) [119, 131, 139, 151} {159, 171, 179} sts from waste yarn to smaller 32" / 80 cm needle. Join yarn and, beginning with a RS row, work in ribbing same as Back for 3" / 7.5 cm, end on WS. Bind off using sewn tubular bind-off.

FINISHING

Armhole Bands: With RS facing, using smaller 16" / 40 cm needle, beginning at underarm, pick up and knit approximately 2 sts for every 3 rows around entire armhole edge (exact st count isn't crucial, but must be an even number).

Place marker and join for working in the round. Work even in k1, p1 ribbing for 4 rounds. Bind off using sewn tubular bind-off. Weave in all ends and block as desired.

STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginningBOR: beginning of roundinc: increasek: knit

M1L: Make 1 Left—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

p: purl
pm: place marker
rep: repeat
RH: right hand
rnd(s): round(s)
RS: right side
sl: slip
sm: slip marker
st(s): stitch(es)


St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

WS: wrong side

- A (Body Circumference): (36, 40, 44) [48, 52, 56, 60] {64, 68, 72}" / (91.5, 101.5, 112) [122, 132, 142, 152.5] {162.5, 172.5, 183} cm
- **B** (Collar Circumference): (20, 20, 20) [21¼, 21¼, 22¼, 22¼] {23½, 23½, 23½] / (51, 51, 51) [54, 54, 56.5, 56.5] {59.5, 59.5, 59.5} cm
- C (Body Length): (12, 12, 12) [12, 12, 12, 10] {10, 10, 10}" / (30.5, 30.5, 30.5) [30.5, 30.5, 30.5, 25.5] {25.5, 25.5, 25.5} cm
- D (Armhole Length): (7, 7½, 8) [8, 8½, 8½, 9] {9, 9½, 10}" / (18, 19, 20.5) [20.5, 21.5, 21.5, 23] {23, 24, 25.5} cm
- E (Shoulder Length): (2¼, 3¼, 3¾) [4, 4¾, 5, 6] {6¼, 7, 7½}" / (5.5, 8, 9.5) [10, 12, 12.5, 15] {16, 18, 19} cm
- F (Collar Length): 10" / 25.5 cm
