FINISHED MEASUREMENTS Approximately 7½" around x 10" long

YARN

BERROCO NOMAD (50 grs): 1 ball #9116 Cast Iron

NEEDLES and NOTIONS

1 set double-pointed needles, size 9 (5.50 mm) or size to obtain gauge Stitch markers Removable stitch marker Tapestry needle Stitch holders/waste yarn for thumbs

GAUGE

13 sts and 20 rnds = 4" in St st *To save time and ensure accurate* measurements, take time to check gauge.

MITTEN (Make 2)

Note: Mittens are worked in the round from the top down to the wrist. For the Turkish cast-on method, see our video at:

Thumb: With 2 dpns, using the Turkish cast-on method, cast on 6 sts (3 on each needle). Place a removable stitch marker for beg-of-rnd, then knit 1 round.

Inc Rnd: K1, [k1, M1] 4 times, k1—4 sts inc'd (10 sts on the needles).

Divide stitches over 3 needles, then work even in St st (knit EVERY round) for 11 rounds, or until thumb is desired length to thumb placement. Place the first 2 sts of the next round onto waste yarn for thumb join, place remaining 8 stitches on a holder.

Hand: With 2 dpns, using the Turkish cast-on method, cast on 12 stitches (6 on each needle). Place a removable stitch marker to indicate beg-of-rnd, then knit 1 round.

Inc Rnd: * K1, M1R, knit to the last stitch on the needle, M1L, k1; repeat from * on second needle—4 sts inc'd. Knit 1 round. Rep the last 2 rounds twice more—24 sts on the needles.

Divide stitches over 3 needles, then work even in St st for 16 rounds, or until mitten is desired length from top of mitten to thumb placement.

Place Thumb:

Next Rnd: K11, pm, slip the next 2 stitches onto waste yarn for thumb join and replace with the 8 thumb stitches from waste yarn, pm, knit to end—30 sts. Knit 3 rounds. Dec Rnd: Knit to first marker, sm, SSK, knit to 2 sts before next marker, k2tog, sm, knit to end—2 sts dec'd. Rep the last 4 rounds twice more—24 sts. Work even in St st for 3½" from last decrease round. Bind off knitwise.

FINISHING

Weave thumb join stitches left on waste yarn together. Weave in all ends and block as desired.





STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning

CC: contrasting color

cn: cable needle

dec: decrease

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row.

end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row

Garter St: Knit EVERY row when working back and forth in rows. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working in the round.

inc: increase

k: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

LH: left hand

M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

MC: main color

p: purl

p2tog: purl 2 stitches together

pm: place marker

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat

RH: right hand

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

sl: slip

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back loops.

st(s): stitch(es)

St st: Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over
