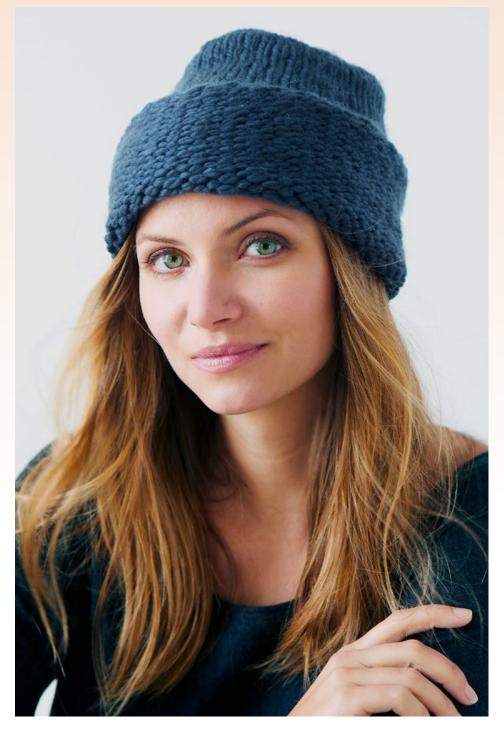

**skill level:** Easy

One size

#### finished measurements

Approximately 16" around x 13" high (unstretched with brim unrolled)

#### materials

BERROCO NOBLE (100 grs): 1 ball #2056 Tussilago 1 set (4) each double pointed needles (dpns), size 13 (9.00 mm) and 15 (10.00 mm) or size to obtain gauge 1 st marker Tapestry needle

#### gauge

10 sts and 17 rnds = 4" in St st on larger needles
To save time, take time to check gauge.

# Berroco Noble™

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**NOTE:** We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this book are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. We cannot be responsible for variance of individual knitters, human or typographical errors.

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### **HAT**

With smaller dpns, cast on 40 sts. Divide sts onto 3 needles, pm and join for working in the round. Work even in St st (knit EVERY rnd) for 9 rnds. Change to larger dpns and work even in St st until piece measures 11" from beg.

**Shape Top: Dec Rnd 1:** \* K2tog, k4, SSK, rep from \* around – 30 sts. Knit 1 rnd.

**Dec Rnd 2:** \* K2tog, k2, SSK, rep from \* around – 20 sts. Knit 1 rnd.

**Dec Rnd 3:** \* K2tog, SSK, rep from \* around – 10 sts. Break off yarn, leaving an 8" long end. Thread end into tapestry needle and draw through all sts on needles. Pull up tightly and secure, then fasten off.



## **ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS**

**beg:** beginning **dec:** decrease

**dpn(s):** double pointed needle(s)

k: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

pm: place marker
rep: repeat
rnd(s): round(s)

**SSK:** Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2

together.

st(s): stitch(es)

**Stockinette stitch (St st):** Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.
