LARGE SNOWFLAKE

Begin with a sliding loop.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, work 8 sc in loop, join with a sl st in beg ch-1. Pull up loop and fasten securely.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same sp, * ch 5, 2 dc in next sc, rep from * 6 times more, ch 2, dc in 3rd st of beg ch – 8 ch-5 loops.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, sl st in top of final dc on last rnd, [ch 3, sl st in same sp] twice (picot group made), * ch 9, picot group in center st of next ch-5 loop, rep from * 6 times more, ch 4, double tr in dc – 8 ch-9 loops.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, sc over double tr, * ch 9, [sc, ch 3, sc] in next ch-9 loop, rep from * around, ending ch 4, double tr in double tr. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends and block as desired. Note: We sprayed with spray-starch and pinned the points to a blocking board using stainless steel pins, the left to dry.



SMALL SNOWFLAKE

Begin with a sliding loop.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, * sc in loop, ch 10, rep from * 5 times more, join with a sl st in beg sc. Fasten off. Pull up loop and fasten securely.

Rnd 2: Join yarn with a sl st in any ch-10 sp, ch 1, [sc, ch 3, sc] in same sp, ch 5, * [sc, ch 3, sc] in next ch-10 sp, ch 5, rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, * 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, skip next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, join with a sl st in beg sc.

Rnd 4: Sl st in first 2 sc, ch 1, [sc, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, sc] in same sc, * ch 5, sc under both ch-5 chains from previous 2 rnds, ch 5, **, [sc, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, sc] in center sc of next 5-sc group, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join with a sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends and block as desired. Note: We sprayed with spray-starch and pinned the points to a blocking board using stainless steel pins, the left to dry.

beg: beginning

CC: contrasting color

cont: continue

ch: chain

dec: decrease

dc: double crochet

dtr: double treble crochet

est: established

hdc: half double crochet

inc: increase

MC: main color

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

RS: right side

sc: single crochet

sl st: slip stitch

sliding loop: Form a loop of yarn around your fingers, with the end attached to the ball on the right and the tail on the left. Insert hook into the loop under both pieces of yarn and draw up a loop onto hook. (This does not count as your first stitch.) Work first row into the original loop. Pull up the yarn tail after your first row is complete to close the loop.

sp: space

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

tr: treble

WS: wrong side

yo: yarn over
